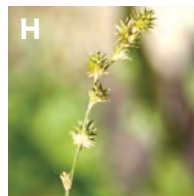
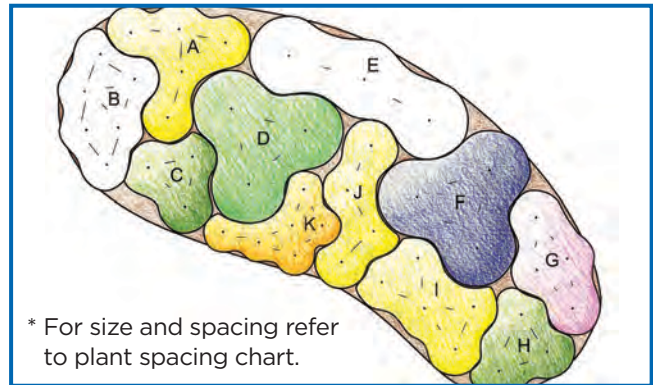




NATIVE PLANTING AREA - PARTIAL SHADE
